



Dear parent/caregiver

Since the middle of last term we have been preparing our students, through the pathways program, to plan and select their subjects for 2022. This process involves career planning and 'backwards planning' for students to decide the best subjects to select to achieve their preferred post school pathway. We have published our 2022 [Course Selection Handbook](#) on our website and invited all families to an information evening at the end of term 2 to provide families an opportunity to seek more information from Area of Learning Leaders and subject specialists.

The students have now been emailed their login code to access the online subject selection portal, Web Preferences, which we use to support students in making their subject selections for 2022. Students will need to finalise their subject selections over the next 3 weeks. We expect that students have discussions with families and carers and their subject and home group teachers in preparation for their final decisions. It is important that students choose their subjects carefully as their choices will be used to construct the 2022 timetable and determine which subjects we are able to offer and the numbers of students in each class. There will be limited opportunity for students to make changes to subjects after the timetable is constructed.

This year we will be conducting our Course Confirmation Day on one day across all year levels, **Tuesday 10 August 2021**. We will open the School Interviews portal, (the same that we use for Student/Parent/Teacher conferences), so that you can book appointment times with your student's home group teacher to clarify any questions or concerns you have about the selections and confirm the subject selections made.

For students going into Senior School, there will be the opportunity to ask questions and clarify information available for future pathways including TAFE, University, SATAC and SACE information. The VET/SACE Coordinator will be available for questions.
