Majority vote (6) of Governing Council approves canteen's request.

Multiple bin concepts to be introduced into schools before the end of the year to promote sustainability across sites. Students have been requesting this for a while anyway, so will hopefully be successfully implemented. Bins will be supplied via Department, so will be interesting to see how they plan schools to ensure cross contamination does not occur — will they expect staff or students to conduct this process, or will external staff provide this service?

Some variations in budget due to site-funded works, utilities and maintenance, non budget expenditure, parent contributions, and liability lines.

Proposed increase of \$50 to \$550 for next year's Materials & Services fee total due to increased costs in delivering curriculum and cost of living impacts. GC last year proposed two small increases over 2 years as opposed to one big increase in 2024. The \$100 subsidy from the government will continue next year for families.

All governing council members in favour of the proposed increase of \$50 to \$550 for M&S fee in 2024; moved by Jason, seconded by Janet.

Charge to be discussed at next GC meeting 11th Sept and if approved, electronic poll to school community will be undertaken.

Debt write off for three debts: supplier and M&S fees: The governing council approve the write off of 3 debts for Supplier and M&S fees debt total \$4446.16 in accordance with the recommendation of the Principal.
